Why target the Latin-Hispanic consumer?



- Latin American Canadians are the fastest growing segments of the Canadian economy.
- The population of Latin Americans in B.C. has increased significantly since **2016**, according to the census data.
- Census data shows Spanish is spoken by **23,225** immigrants at home across B.C. The number of native Spanish speakers has increased **21.5** per cent since **2016**.
- Diverse range of countries (Mexico, Colombia, Venezuela) in the Latin American region contributing to the pool of immigrants coming to B.C.
- Vancouver DMA size is larger than Ottawa and Calgary. Strong opportunity to reach them with digital Spanish-language content and cultural purposes.

Advantages of reaching the Latin-Hispanic consumer




- Vancouver, B.C has no full time 24/7 Spanishlanguage radio nor internet radio.
- The market is undeserved and lacks outreach to the Latin-Hispanic community living, working or residing in this metro area.
- No Spanish-language Canadian news aired in any stations in Vancouver nor the rest of British Columbia.

The Americas accounted for **11.53 per cent** of immigrants to B.C. over the last **five years**.



- La Bonita X101 is the *oldies but goodies* Spanish Adult Hits format. The format plays classic crossover Latin oldies from the 70s, 80s, 90s and 2000s. Primary Latin ballads such as Emmanuel, Los Bukis, Rocio Durcal, Juan Gabriel, Bronco, Roberto Carlos and more. The format also carries occasional Cumbia and Regional Mexican rotations as well.
- The format targets the older Latin-Hispanic population, primary **45-64**.

- The show aires on **La Bonita** in the afternoons.
- The most recognized Spanish-language voice in the U.S and Mexico with over 18 years of radio experience.


